### FROM THE PASTOR

As we begin our fall programs it is also time to update our mentors for the Sticky Faith program. If you recall, we implanted this program to assist our youth as they go through High School and go off to college. The program was started after we heard Dr. Kara E. Powell speak at one of our ECO Synod gatherings. Dr. Powell reflected on some studies put out by the Fuller Youth Institute (FYI) that 40 to 50% of our students, who graduate from High School and are active in church activities, will leave their faith when they go off to college. That is just not acceptable. The FYI came up with a program called Sticky Faith that assigns a mentor who will meet with them regularly (at least once a month), someone who will pray for them and someone who will write letters or notes to them. The idea is the more adults our youth have in support of them, the greater the chance they will not leave their faith during their college years.

Still unsure of what our youth are facing at a college level, Anna Kitko, the campus director for the University of Tennessee in Knoxville says that the postmodern worldview is taken for granted by professors at colleges today. She said, "because objective reality does not exist from a postmodern philosophical world view, everything is relative; you have your truth and I have mine; there is no point of reference for words, rejection of the sacred, no moral accountability and no coherence." There is actually a "Manual for Creating Atheists" and some professors and students see their role as undermining everything Christian parents, Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, and pastors have taught for those arriving on campus.


All the more reason that we have mentors for our youth. I realize that trying to find a time to meet with the youth can be difficult because their schedules are very busy, let alone your own. The best way to get in touch with the youth will be through your phone; the youth tend to text better than answer a call. Some of the better times to meet are during their lunch hour or just after school. Take them for ice cream, coffee, or a smoothie. Your job is to get to know them, what their concerns are and challenges, be a listening ear, and give support. Whether you are considering being a mentor who meets with our youth, a mentor who prays for them, or a mentor who sends a note-card or letter, our youth desperately need our support. Specifics of what each mentorship entails can be found by contacting the church with your interest.

God is calling us to this task as Peter tells us in I Peter 5: 2a and 5 - "Be shepherds of the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." (ESV)

The ministry is not a 9 to 5 job, but a calling to be available to people 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, many times at the sacrifice of their own needs and those of their families. Pastors' write, "I wish someone would have told me how tough it is to be a pastor. Preaching the Word was my priority. I was caught off-guard by the realities of local church life, death by a non-ending stream of criticisms, cutting, unfair, fault/blame, giving all I had to give, but still not enough, spiritual warfare...the enemy intent on destroying my ministry, all inevitably resulting in a sense of inadequacy over time, an emotional downward spiral into depression. It wears on you, it takes a toll, not just on me, but my marriage, my family! And the loneliness, finding a true friend to share your struggles with when you are a I wish someone had told me how tough it is to be a pastor!" In 2000 they headed back to the Midwest to Dubuque, IA, and UDTS Theological Seminary. Scott earned an M.Div. and served as the student pastor for 2 small churches in rural lowa. In 2004 they moved to Little Rock, IA, where Scott has served as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church for more than 13 years. They have 4 children.



Stipulations for responding to our invitation for assistance and card usage:




